

Weather permitting, the Public Works Department will be doing a one-time special curbside brush pick-up for the tree damage resulting from the wind on February 24-25 and the snow storm on March 3-4. The pick-up will begin on Monday, March 11th. Residents must purchase tags/stickers the same as are issued for annual usage of the curbside collection. Branches (with tag) must be placed at the curbside of the street. Do not place at roadway intersections or in the roadway itself. Tree trunks and limbs in excess of eight inches in diameter shall not be collected. Limbs must not be longer than 10 feet in length. All limbs under four inches in diameter shall be tied with twine (no wire, nylon string, etc.) in manageable bundles and placed in an orderly manner with all butts (eight inches in diameter maximum) facing the roadside. Do not place in bags, buckets and/or cans. No curbside collection of said branches will be accepted for any work performed at any residence by anyone (e.g., contractors) other than the homeowner or tenant. The Public Works Department road crew will have full discretion to reject materials it deems inappropriate for storm emergency collection. After paying the fee, residents may participate in the regular curbside collection. Under this storm emergency provision only, residents should call the Public Works Department, (908) 689-0812, for scheduling, and all branches must be curbside at 6:00 a.m. on Monday March 11th. The chipping crew will work each road only once and will not return. It will be at the Department Supervisor's discretion to reject any brush pile not to the above specifications. Residents may also take storm-related debris to the Convenience Center on Front Street at no charge through March 30th. The Center will be opened for this special storm-related event weekdays from 6:00 am - 2:00 pm, on Saturday, March 9th from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm and closed on Sundays. After March the normal schedule as per Ordinance #2010-17 will resume.
